EMILY GRACE JORDAN \diamond Emily moved to Cincinnati from Washington, D.C., to study at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, where she earned a bachelor's degree in music education and, later, a master's degree in jazz studies. Emily is head of education for the Cincinnati Contemporary Jazz Orchestra and teaches music in the public schools. She can be heard regularly around Cincinnati, including at Caffe Vivace, Ghost Baby, Muse Cafe, Schwartz's Point, and the Hilton Nether-

land Plaza. She is a member of the Queen City Sisters jazz a cappella singing group. She first performed with the Devou-Doo Daddies in 2023.



RICK MARKSBERRY Rick has been entertaining Greater Cincinnati for five decades at night clubs from the Beverly Hills Supper Club to Jeff Ruby restaurants. He has appeared as vocalist and bass player with the Goshorn Brothers and played with numerous artists, from Bootsy Collins to Midnight Star, and has recorded nearly 100 local commercials and jingles. He began lending his soulful voice to the KSO's Boogie Band in 2001. Rick has been married for 50 years and has three children and six grandchildren.



JOSHUA STEELE ◆ Josh has been a part of KSO performances for more than a decade. He is the leader and arranger for the a cappella group No Promises Vocal Band and also performs with his acoustic trio, the Three Bald Guys. Laney is a music supervisor, sync agent, and clearance specialist through Scene Support Music, a company she founded that places Cincinnati music in films, advertisements, and TV shows.

Laney served as director of bands at Franklin High School, near Dayton, Ohio, for five years and taught nine years at Badin High School in Hamilton, Ohio, where she founded the Badin Rocks Ensemble, a 45-piece high school rock band – the first of its kind in Ohio. She earned master's degrees in conducting from the American Band College of Sam Houston State University and in music education from Bowling Green State University, where she also earned a bachelor's degree in music education.




