



Dan Radank (Frank Sinatra) was born on St Patrick's Day (his mother's birthday too) and was in the lime-light from day one. The local news was there to tape Dan's mother, Patty, sing "Danny Boy" to him on their birthday. Music was the first thing he heard and it never left him. His father, Tom, was a professional jazz trumpet player in Milwaukee when Dan was born. By age 11, Dan was ready to pick up an instrument — the trumpet.

Having moved to Northern Kentucky, Dan excelled in band through high school, participating in the KY All-State Jazz Band and the Governor's School for the Arts. He received a scholarship to the University of Louisville, where he played in several jazz ensembles. Dan soon decided to leave school to play professionally joining Bobby J and The Flying Martinis. For four years they were atop the Louisville jazz scene, playing classics from the Great American songbook. Dan found his voice, emulating the great crooners. Soon his musician friends encouraged him to sing professionally.

In 2007, Dan moved back to Cincinnati and works with some of the best musicians in the city. You can hear him headlining with the bands Powerhouse, The Bluewater Kings, and The Chairman of the Board Orchestra. Old Green Eyes (as he was dubbed) has over 800 songs in his repertoire.

Mickey James (Dean Martin) is a Cincinnati native, vocalist, dancer, entertainer, and the Owner / Manager of Mickey James Entertainment. Mickey performs regularly in the tristate area with his 6-piece band, "Mickey James & the Queen City Crew." He started singing and entertaining as a child, and around 2005 got his start with jazz/standards when he was hired as a vocalist by the PMC Big Band. Since then, Mickey has performed with many fantastic bands including the Johnny Mack Big Band, the Jump N' Jive Big Band, Swingtime Big Band, the Monday Night Big Band. He is thrilled to be performing with the Kentucky Symphony Orchestra.



Corey Tucker, (Sammy Davis, Jr.) is an American recording artist and entrepreneur. A native of Tennessee, Corey moved to Cincinnati at an early age. Corey spent most of his early years performing in church and school, singing and directing choirs, leading the church band, and helping other artists find their voice. Corey uses his music and performance to relate to and unite people.

The music that influenced him the most was blues, classic soul, R&B and gospel. He remains drawn to the music's realness, raw grit, and passion with which he identifies. Corey contends that — "It is the authenticity in the words and music that brings us together."

Corey studied music at The Ohio State University, where he continued to sing in choirs and write songs, and where he realized that he wanted to be a performer. After graduating he began working in the corporate world, while building a pre-production studio to hone his sound and production skills. Corey knows his way around the business, instruments, composing/arranging and recording. Corey Tucker has appeared at the Taste of Cincy, Oktoberfest, opened for Blessid Union of Souls and made his debut last September with the KSO's Boogie Band.
